Cameron L. Randall, PhD, is a clinical health psychologist and Assistant Professor at the University of Washington School of Dentistry in Seattle. His NIH-funded research focuses on pain, dental fear, health behavior, and providers' implementation of evidence-based practice. This work has been recognized with awards from the NIH and the International Association for Dental Research, among others. Dr. Randall also researches and speaks on topics related to workforce wellness. He serves in leadership positions in the International Association for Dental Research and the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry, and he is a member of the editorial boards for *Community Dentistry and Oral Epidemiology* and *JDR Clinical and Translational Research*. He co-organized the 2020 Behavioral and Social Oral Health Sciences Summit, was a lead author of the Consensus Statement on Future Directions for the Behavioral and Social Sciences in Oral Health, and was a contributor for the recently released NIH report, *Oral Health in America*. Dr. Randall completed his undergraduate studies (BS) at UNC Chapel Hill, his graduate studies (MS, PhD) at West Virginia University, and his clinical psychology internship training at the University of Washington, where he was a resident in behavioral medicine and neuropsychology.
